Inside PJM's 50 MW line: how IRAS reshapes large-load treatment from 2027

PJM filed its Interim Resource Adequacy Service proposal with FERC on August 13, 2026, in docket ER26-3515-000. The filing follows the [PJM board's July 27, 2026 decisional letter](#) directing action on resource adequacy, affordability, and large loads. It sets a single number that now governs large-load treatment across the grid: [50 MW](#). New Large Loads at or above that threshold that do not bring their own supply face a new reliability regime from June 1, 2027, and exclusion from RPM demand calculations starting with the 2029/2030 auction.

- [PJM files IRAS large-load framework with FERC](#) – The Aug. 13 filing formalizes Connect and Manage as Interim Resource Adequacy Service, adds a Large Load Registry, and shifts reliability and retail cost responsibility toward states, utilities, and large-load customers.
- [Pennsylvania EO 2026-05 targets data-center curtailment](#) – Pennsylvania directs advocacy for utility tariff revisions curtailing data centers before other customers during emergencies unless they secure incremental capacity for their full demand.
- [Virginia SCC and Data Center Coalition propose model tariffs](#) – Their June 30 letter urges model retail interruptible tariffs and cost-allocation provisions for large loads, with DCC members committing to bear the costs of serving their load.
- [Delhi Master Plan 2047 permits data centres in industrial areas](#) – A Government of India release says the plan permits data centres in industrial areas and envisages around 40 lakh new affordable housing units plus industrial parks.
- [Micron unveils \\$10B Micron Research Labs in Boise](#) – Micron says the R&D hub, breaking ground in 2027 with about 250 initial staff, builds on its previously announced \$200B-plus U.S. manufacturing and R&D plans and targets AI memory bottlenecks including HBM.
- [Zayo locks long-term Corning fiber supply for AI backbone](#) – The Aug. 20 agreement secures a major portion of the cable for Zayo's plan to add 15,000 route miles by 2030,

including more than 8,000 miles of long-haul fiber in collaboration with NVIDIA.

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
