

US Data Center Daily Briefing

September 11, 2026

KEY THEMES

- PEC's Sept. 10, 2026 call for a statewide Virginia data-center moratorium
- Dominion's 25 GW dated, 45 GW without connection dates, plus GS-5 rate class effective Jan. 2027
- PJM's Jan. 2026 large-load package: Expedited Interconnection Track by Aug. 2026
- Loudoun and Prince William county zoning rewrites as the moratorium-like local actions

Virginia's data-center moratorium is a PEC ask; the live actions are Dominion, SCC, PJM, DEQ, and county dockets

On September 10, 2026, the Piedmont Environmental Council [called on Virginia's state leaders to declare a moratorium](#) on connecting data centers to the grid, approving new transmission lines, permitting backup generation, and allowing new water withdrawals. That request frames a set of demands around six issues. The concrete government and utility actions on large-load data centers sit in separate proceedings across Dominion, the SCC, PJM, DEQ, and county planning offices. The most moratorium-like measures on the record are local zoning rewrites in Loudoun and Prince William, not a statewide pause.

- [PEC calls for a statewide data-center moratorium](#) – The Piedmont Environmental Council asked Virginia leaders on September 10, 2026 to pause grid connections, transmission approvals, backup-generation permits, and water withdrawals.
- [Dominion assigns dates to 25 GW, holds 45 GW without connection dates](#) – Dominion Energy's May 2026 GS-5 report set energization dates for 25 GW of new data centers through 2031 and had not yet offered connection dates for another 45 GW.
- [SCC approves GS-5 rate class effective Jan. 1, 2027](#) – The Virginia SCC created a new rate class for customers demanding 25 MW or more, with a 14-year contract term and higher minimum demand charges.
- [Karnataka wind output falls more than 2,000 MW in an intra-day swing](#) – A September 9, 2026 stress event pressured the state grid from roughly 6:30am to 4pm, met by higher central-station drawal, thermal ramping, and exchange purchases.
- [India pegs data-center power demand at 13.56 GW by 2031-32](#) – A Ministry of Power release says AI-enabled data centers help push electricity demand up over 30% by 2030, with demand already factored into government planning.

- [Submer and Madhya Pradesh signed an MoU for up to 1 GW of AI-ready data centers](#) – The July 2025 agreement covers liquid-cooling design standards, local supply chains, and workforce development in the state.

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
